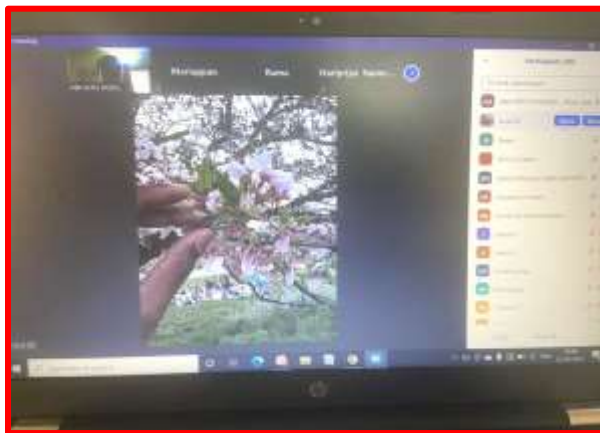

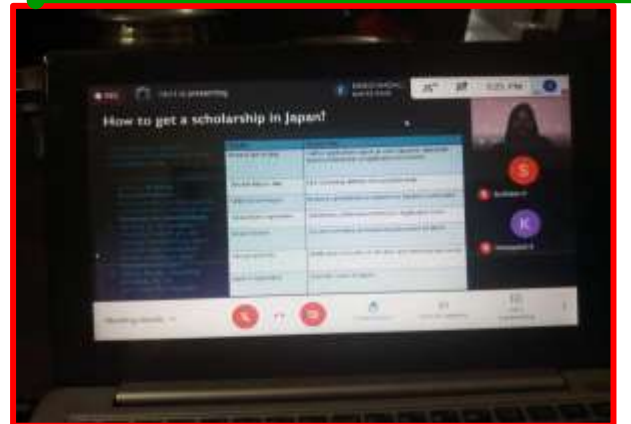
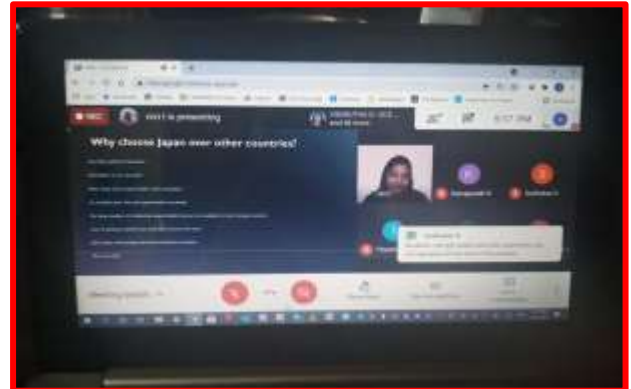

Orientation on Japanese Language - 11 April 2021

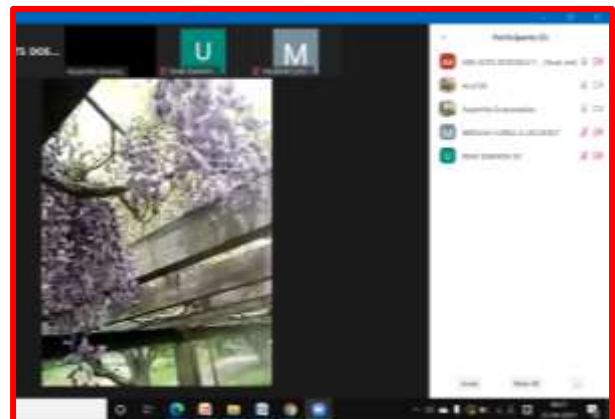

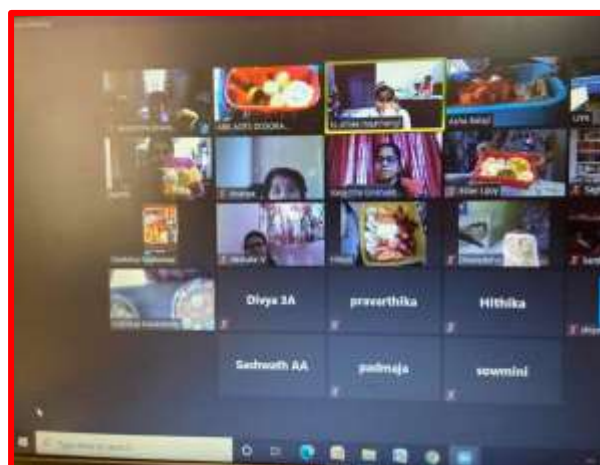
Day 2 on 4th May 2021

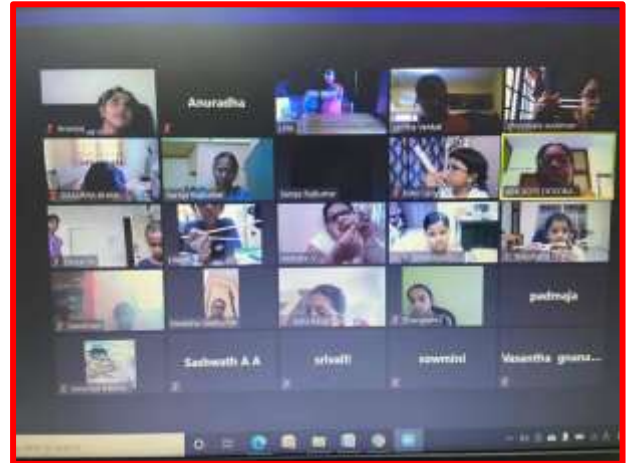

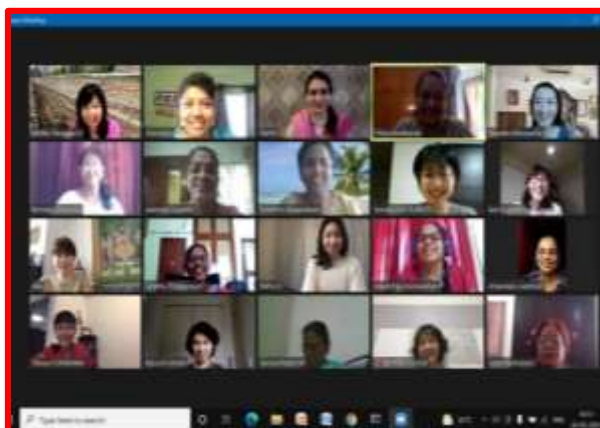




Coffee Meet on Golden Week

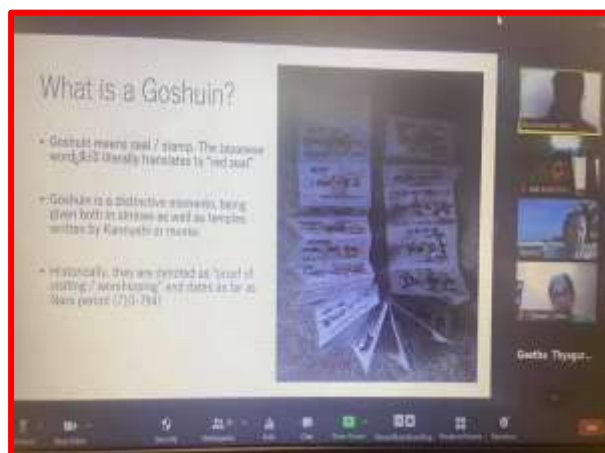


GOSHUIN & GOSHUINCHO

Thank you so much Mithra for sharing your knowledge and experience.

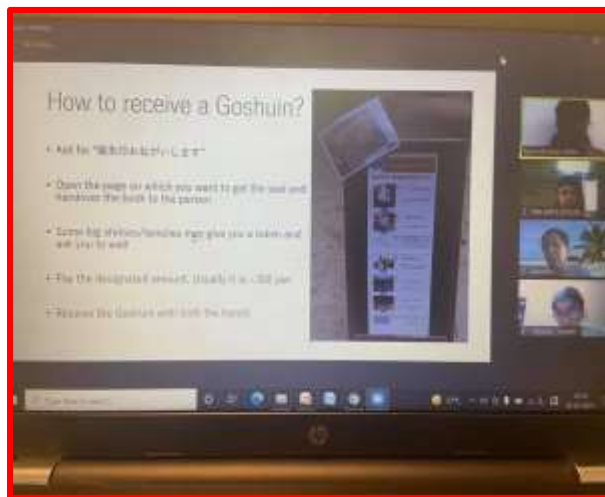




venue / class rooms were sanitized by the Corporation authorities before & after the exams and also our own air purifying machinery was utilized by us to keep the premises with the purified air.

JAPANESE LANGUAGE NAT TEST - 11TH APRIL 2021

The Japanese Language NAT-TEST is an examination that measures the Japanese language ability of students who are not native Japanese speakers. The tests are separated by difficulty (Q1 to Q5) and general ability is measured in three categories: Grammar/Vocabulary, Listening and Reading Comprehension. NAT Test is being held six times a year. ABK – AOTS DOSOKAI, Tamilnadu Centre in association with Senmon Kyouiku, Japan have been conducted the NAT TEST in Chennai held on 11th April 2021 at Vellammal Matriculation Hr. Sec. School, Chennai

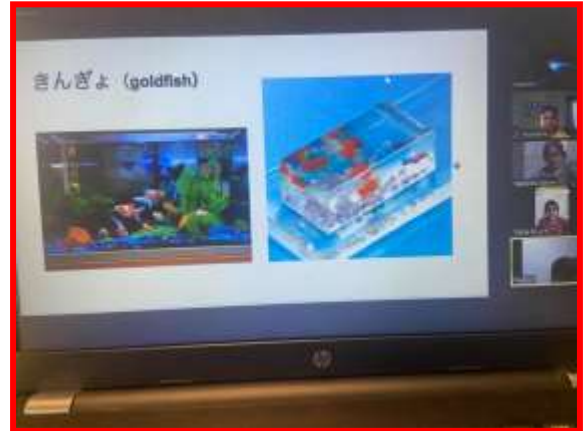

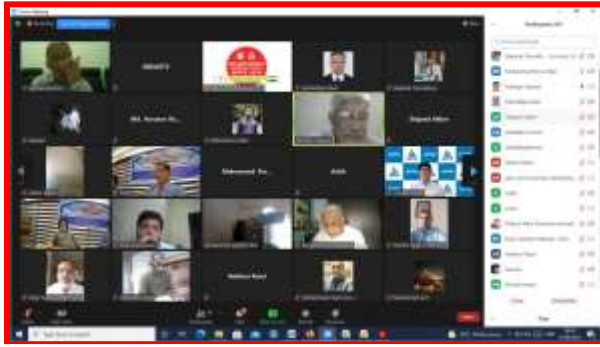


8TH WNF WEBINAR (ONLINE SEMINAR) ON JAPANESE MANAGEMENT : KAIZEN AND 5S IN SMES
